PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

There will be Milcombe Parish Council elections on Thursday 5 May 2022. This means that all Councillors will stand down and all seven seats on the Parish Council are up for election.

If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council or any of the Parish Councillors for more details.

Also, all residents are invited to attend the Milcombe Annual Parish Meeting on Tuesday 22 March 2022 at 7.30pm at the Village Hall. This will provide the opportunity to meet the current Councillors and the Clerk and receive information on the work the Parish Council has undertaken in the last twelve months.

The Parish Council is hoping to embark on a Neighbourhood Development Plan over the coming months and support from the community on this project, which will ultimately protect the village from unsuitable developments, will be essential.

A representative from Community First Oxfordshire will be attending the Annual Parish Meeting to give a presentation and guidance and information on Neighbourhood Development Plans.

Play Area – Due to the ground in the play area being so wet, the play area will remain closed for the time being. This will be kept under review and it will be opened at the earliest opportunity. Apologies for any inconvenience and thank you for your patience.

Wheelie Bins – Residents are kindly requested not to block the footpaths with their wheelie bins, where possible. If they could also be collected back in as soon as they had been emptied, this would avoid the footpaths being blocked for those pedestrians with pushchairs or wheelchair users.

Snow Warden/Grit Bins – If anyone in the village would like or care to volunteer to be a Snow Warden to help clear the footpaths in adverse weather conditions, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council. Grit bins are all full and grit may be used on slippery public footpaths and roads only. It should not be used for private property use.

Highways – Repairs which were required to potholes should be reported to the County Council's Fix My Street web site. https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/ New road markings had been painted on the road by the junction at the Horse and Groom.

Trees/Bushes/Hedges - Residents were reminded that trees/bushes/hedges should not be causing an obstruction because they were overhanging a boundary onto a footpath or road. If an obstruction was occurring in the village, it should be reported to https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/

Oxfordshire County Council Highway Initiatives – Applications will be made to the County Council for a 7.5 ton weight limit and a 20mph speed limit on appropriate roads in the village.

Civil Parking Enforcement – Oxfordshire County Council is providing Civil Parking Enforcement Officers in the Cherwell area and it is hoped that they will monitor Milcombe for illegal parking. For more information and to report illegally parked cars, please visit the OCC web site.

Neighbourhood Development Plan – Initial work would be undertaken to access the feasibility of producing an NDP for Milcombe. It is hoped there will be a presentation from Community First Oxfordshire at the Annual Parish Meeting on this subject.

Adverse Weather:

Oxfordshire County Council works closely with all its partners to monitor the weather and as a reminder there are some numbers that you can call to report weather related issues if you become aware of them:

- To report fallen trees or other debris which pose a risk to your safety or the safety of others, please call 999
- To report fallen trees or other debris which doesn't pose such a high risk but still needs to be dealt with, please call 101
- If you lose power or can see that a power line has come down please report it by calling 105
- If you are concerned about flooding, you should visit the Oxfordshire Flood Toolkit online https://www.oxfordshirefloodtoolkit.com and I will summarise the key numbers to call below:
- If you have a flooding emergency which is a threat to someone's life, contact Oxfordshire Fire and Rescue Service on 999
- To report flooding relating to a highway such as blocked ditches, blocked drains or flooding on a road call Oxfordshire County Council Floodline on 0345 310 1111
- To report flooding from a main river contact the Environment Agency through the Floodline (Tel: 0345 988 1188 or 0800 80 70 60) or visit their website
- If your property is at immediate risk of surface water flooding please contact Thames Valley Police on 101
