**Vacancies** – Due to resignations, there are three vacancies on the Parish Council. The role entails attending a Parish Council meeting every other month, for around 2 hours and you can put in, as much or as little time as you have available, in-between the meetings. **Elections** – The next local elections are being held on 6 May 2021, however the next Parish Council elections will be held in May 2022. Census – Census day was 21 March 2021 and information could be completed on-line. https://census.gov.uk/

**Assets of Community Value** – Registration of the village hall, Horse and Groom, Dovecote, Paradise Lane field and the village shop would be investigated.

Oxfordshire Community and Voluntary Action (OCVA) and Community First Oxfordshire (CFO) are managing this grant scheme on behalf of Oxfordshire County Council.

Footpaths in Bloxham - Walkers going over Hobb Hill will notice posts and string at the gates and on the footpath. The farmer is using these to guide users to the location of the Public Right of Way. The farmer will be making hay in the field this year. If the ground becomes compacted it becomes unusable. Walkers should try to keep to the right, close to the hedge on the way up from Courtington Lane and at the top, walk straight down to the kissing gate at the bottom on Ells Lane. Please keep to the paths and enjoy your walks up Hobb Hill...a good pair of wellies / boots always helps.

Wheelie Bins – Residents are kindly requested not to block the footpaths with their wheelie bins, where possible. If they could also be collected back in as soon as they had been emptied, this would avoid the footpaths being blocked for those pedestrians with pushchairs or wheelchair users.

Road Closure - Temporary Traffic Regulation Notice – S14 Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 Temporary Road Closure at 6 Church Lane, Milcombe - A request has been received by the County Council from KCD/Thames Water for a temporary road closure to apply to a section of Church Lane whilst Thames Water service pipe relay works are carried out. The temporary closures will operate from the 29/03/2021 to and including the 31/03/2021 (full closure 24hrs each day). ### WINTER SUPPORT GRANTS AVAILABLE TO HELP PEOPLE FINANCIALLY HIT BY THE PANDEMIC

Financial help is available for people struggling to feed their families or heat their homes this winter as a result of the impact of the Covid-19 Pandemic.

Oxfordshire was awarded £400,000 by the Government and claims must be made by 31 March 2021.

Households with children can claim up to £350 and those without children can receive up to £175.

Support teams provide funding through supermarket vouchers, costs for pre-payment meters or make sure that a heating or water bill is paid.


