

Dear Residents of Milcombe

As we watch the TV footage of civil disobedience in Austria, Belgium and the Netherlands against the re-imposition of Covid restrictions, we have to hope that the same will not happen here. It does seem clear that the greater willingness of UK citizens to take the vaccine, and the tremendous efforts of the NHS to administer it, has played a key part in keeping the number of hospitalisations within manageable proportions. I extend my sympathies to anyone who fell victim to this dreadful disease. While all of us rely on District Council services to some extent, dustbin emptying to give one example (and I should like to pay tribute to the crews for their herculean efforts through the lockdowns when the quantities of household waste increased significantly due to most of us relying on home deliveries), many will not have cause to contact the Council more than very occasionally. For those others who are in more regular contact, I hope that the service we provide to you (ranging from efficiently handling your initial phone call, or other means of contact, through to delivery of the service or response to your query) was as you would wish it to be. Certainly, the figures I see indicate that, while we could always do better, on the whole we are performing satisfactorily. If your personal experience is different please let me know and I will follow up on it.

Because Oxfordshire maintains a split-Council model, with both a County Council and a District Council, there is always some confusion about where the responsibilities of one Council ends and the other begins. Essentially, Cherwell District Council deals with planning matters, housing, dustbin emptying and licensing while Oxfordshire County Council deals with highways, transport and social care (both adults and children). If you have any concerns about where to direct your query please do not hesitate to contact me and, if need be, I can pass it on to your County Councillor (Cllr Kieron Mallon)

Like many small communities, residents of Milcombe may have concerns about what they perceive to be over-development. I am very alive to these concerns (living in a small village myself) and am constantly feeding these concerns to the Leadership of the Council. As I sit on the Planning Committee, I am well placed to comment, and vote, on individual applications which come before that committee and believe that I have a good track record of not supporting vast developments in inappropriate locations which would overwhelm their host communities. I have supported smaller developments which have, as their primary focus, the provision of housing for those who would otherwise have to leave their home-village. Of course, the District Council has to act in accordance with the legal position, as it applies to the whole of England, and thus we are bound, amongst other factors, by the provisions of the National Planning Policy Framework which requires the District to keep available a 5-year Housing Land Supply. The calculations to determine how much land-supply we have is extremely complicated (one of the variables taken into account is the speed with which development progresses once permission has been granted, which is clearly outside the Council's control) but at the moment Cherwell maintains 4.7 years. The main reason that it is important to achieve the 5-years is that this gives us some bulwark against speculative developments which are much harder to resist if we don't maintain the requisite number of years. Cherwell is striving to get back to the 5-years. You may also be aware of recent consultations which have taken place with regard the new Cherwell Plan 2040 and the Oxfordshire Plan 2050. Between them, these two plans will have a profound effect on land usage in our District and I would urge all residents to engage with them.

Residents who travel to Banbury may have noticed that the Castle Quay development progresses at pace. The new Lidl supermarket has now opened and the new Light Cinema complex will be opening sometime before Easter next year. This exciting development will contain a 55,000 square foot entertainment space over three floors, which will include a premium cinema, 10 lanes of bowling, a retro arcade, mini golf, as well as a terrace restaurant and bar. Many wondered about the wisdom of Cherwell District Council's decision, in December 2017, to purchase the outstanding 85% which it did not own of the Castle Quay Shopping Centre. I supported, and voted for, it. This project was never conceived as a purely commercial transaction but, with the previous owners looking to sell their stake, it provided an opportunity for the District Council to take full control of the regeneration of Banbury Town Centre of which the new Castle Quay Waterfront development is but a part.

There are many other topics I could touch on but it might be easier if you were to contact me on any subject of concern to you (or to praise some aspect of the Council, its employees or its work). One of the main duties of a District Councillor is to be available to their constituents to help in any way (or, if it is outside our area of competence, to direct the concern to the right destination). Parish Council Precept 2022/2023 – The Parish Council increased the Precept (the funds it receives from Cherwell District Council to provide services such as grass cutting, maintaining street furniture, providing and maintaining the play area etc) from £13,500 to £14,000 for 2022/2023.

Milcombe Newsletter – Thanks were passed to Mark Boardman for continuing to print the MNL on behalf of the village. The December 2021 and January 2022 edition would be combined.

Play Equipment – The installation of the new equipment is taking place during November 2021 and the play area will be closed for the whole of the month. Please do not enter the play area whilst the works are being carried out.

Remembrance Day – Councillors Myra Peters and Nigel Davis would lay wreaths on behalf of the Parish Council at the Remembrance Day services in Bloxham and Milcombe on Sunday 14 November 2021.

The Choir of Exeter College, Oxford – The Choir will be at St Mary's Church, Bloxham on Saturday 4 December 2021 at 7.30pm.

Christmas Party 2021 – The children's Christmas party is being held in the Village Hall on Saturday, December 4th from 4pm to 6pm organised by the Hall committee. Numbers are restricted to children living in the village. Details will be advertised on the Milcombe community page.

Wheelie Bins – Residents are kindly requested not to block the footpaths with their wheelie bins, where possible. If they could also be collected back in as soon as they had been emptied, this would avoid the footpaths being blocked for those pedestrians with pushchairs or wheelchair users.

Snow Warden/Grit Bins – If anyone in the village would like or care to volunteer to be a Snow Warden to help clear the footpaths in adverse weather conditions, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council. Grit bins are all full and grit may be used on slippery public footpaths and roads only. It should not be used for private property use.

Hedges – Hedges on New Road and on the way to Rye Hill Golf Course had been reported to the County Council because they needed cutting back.

Highways – Repairs which were required to potholes should be reported to the County Council's Fix My Street web site. <https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/> New road markings had been painted on the road by the junction at the Horse and Groom.

Oxfordshire 2050 – The Parish Council had submitted a response to the County Council's consultation.

Trees/Bushes/Hedges – Residents were reminded that trees/bushes/hedges should not be causing an obstruction because they were overhanging a boundary onto a footpath or road. If an obstruction was occurring in the village, it should be reported to <https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/>

Dog Waste Bin – A new dog waste bin would be installed at The Green and the current bin would be moved to the entrance of Dovecote Close.

Oxfordshire County Council Highway Initiatives – Applications will be made to the County Council for a 7.5 ton weight limit and a 20mph speed limit on New Road and the surrounding roads.

Civil Parking Enforcement – Oxfordshire County Council is providing Civil Parking Enforcement Officers in the Cherwell area and it is hoped that they will monitor Milcombe for illegal parking.

Community Emergency Plan – The County Council had been advised that the Village Hall and St Laurence Church could be used as emergency centres, if should they be required.

Adverse Weather:

Oxfordshire County Council works closely with all its partners to monitor the weather and as a reminder there are some numbers that you can call to report weather related issues if you become aware of them:

- To report fallen trees or other debris which pose a risk to your safety or the safety of others, please call 999
- To report fallen trees or other debris which doesn't pose such a high risk but still needs to be dealt with, please call 101
- If you lose power or can see that a power line has come down please report it by calling 105




