Ring 999 in an emergency and the operator will then, if appropriate, instruct the caller to go to the cabinet and they will also give them the code to access the equipment.



# EMERGENCY DEFIBRILLATOR

Our thanks go to Nigel Davis and John Ellison for voluntarily installing the Defibrillator.

If you're on your own, don't interrupt CPR to go and find a defibrillator. If it's possible, send someone else to find one. When you call 999, the operator can tell you if there's a public access defibrillator nearby.

To use a defibrillator, follow these simple steps:

Step 1: Turn the defibrillator on by pressing the green button and follow its instructions.

Step 2: Peel off the sticky pads and attach them to the patient's skin, one on each side of the chest, as shown in the picture on the defibrillator.

Step 3: Once the pads have been attached, stop CPR and don't touch the patient. The defibrillator will then check the patient's heart rhythm.

Step 4: The defibrillator will decide whether a shock is needed and if so, it will tell you to press the shock button. An automatic defibrillator will shock the patient without prompt. Don't touch the patient while they are being shocked.

Step 5: The defibrillator will tell you when the shock has been delivered and whether you need to continue CPR.

Step 6: Continue with chest compressions until the patient shows signs of life or the defibrillator tells you to stop so it can analyse the heartbeat again.

Anyone can use a defibrillator and you don't need training. Once you turn it on, it will give clear instructions on how to attach the defibrillator pads. The device checks the heart rhythm and will only tell you to shock if it's needed. You can't shock someone accidentally.

# PARISH COUNCIL ELECTIONS

Milcombe Parish Council elections were held on Thursday 5 May 2022, but there are still two vacancies. If you are interested in becoming a Parish Councillor, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council, or any of the Parish Councillors, for more details.

**Play Area** – There were still a few minor outstanding issues with the play equipment which were being followed up with the contractor. It was pleasing to see so many children using the new equipment and people were travelling from other villages to use it too.

Wheelie Bins – Residents are kindly requested not to block the footpaths with their wheelie bins, where possible. If they could also be collected back in as soon as they had been emptied, this would avoid the footpaths being blocked for those pedestrians with pushchairs or wheelchair users.

**Highways** – Repairs which were required to potholes should be reported to the County Council's Fix My Street web site. https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/

**Defibrillator** – The defibrillator had been delivered to Councillor Nigel Davis and it would be installed at the Village Hall. The defibrillator was the Parish Council's donation to the village to mark the HM The Queen's Platinum Jubilee, along with the works to the St Laurence Church clock face.

Trees/Bushes/Hedges - Residents were reminded that trees/bushes/hedges should not be causing an obstruction because they were overhanging a boundary onto a footpath or road. If an obstruction was occurring in the village, it should be reported to https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/

#### **Proposed 20mph Speed Restrictions**

– A questionnaire had been circulated in the village, via the newsletter and on-line to obtain the views of residents on the proposal. The deadline of 31 May 2022 had now passed and the results were being analysed.

Civil Parking Enforcement – Oxfordshire County Council is providing Civil Parking Enforcement Officers in the Cherwell area and it is hoped that they will monitor Milcombe for illegal parking. #### **Adverse Weather:**

Oxfordshire County Council works closely with all its partners to monitor the weather and as a reminder there are some numbers that you can call to report weather related issues if you become aware of them:

- To report fallen trees or other debris which pose a risk to your safety or the safety of others, please call 999
- To report fallen trees or other debris which doesn't pose such a high risk but still needs to be dealt with, please call 101
- If you lose power or can see that a power line has come down please report it by calling 105
- If you are concerned about flooding, you should visit the Oxfordshire Flood Toolkit online https://www.oxfordshirefloodtoolkit.com and I will summarise the key numbers to call below:

- •Ifyouhaveafloodingemergencywhich is a threat to someone's life, contact Oxfordshire Fire and Rescue Service on 999
- •To report flooding relating to a highway such as blocked ditches, blocked drains or flooding on a road call Oxfordshire County Council Floodline on 0345 310
- To report flooding from a main river contact the Environment Agency through the Floodline (Tel: 0345 988 1188 or 0800 80 70 60) or visit their website
- If your property is at immediate risk of surface water flooding please contact Thames Valley Police on 101


