

Vacancies - Due to resignations, there report weather related issues if you become are two vacancies on the Parish Council. The role entails attending a Parish Council meeting every other month, for around 2 hours and you can put in, as much or as little time as you have available, in-between the meetings. Covid-19 Community Support – The Parish Council thanks Sam Hughes and all the volunteers providing the village with support during the Covid-19 Pandemic.

Grit Bin - A new grit bin would be installed on Wigginton Heath Road, opposite the entrance to Heath Close.

Wheelie Bins – Residents are kindly requested not to block the footpaths with their wheelie bins, where possible. If they could also be collected back in as soon as they had been emptied, this would avoid the footpaths being blocked for those pedestrians with pushchairs or wheelchair users.

**Grass Cutting** – The Parish Council ceased the grass cutting at the start of the Government lockdown, however, this has now restarted.

**Dog Fouling** – Residents are asked to ensure that they clean up after their dogs because a lot of mess had not been picked up, especially along Main Street. Free dog waste bags were available in the Church porch and New Road Stores.

**Highways** – Repairs which were required to potholes should be reported to the County Council's Fix My Street web site. https:// fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/

Trees/Bushes/Hedges - Residents were reminded that trees/bushes/hedges should not be causing an obstruction because they were overhanging a boundary onto a footpath or road. If an obstruction was occurring in the village, it should be reported to https:// fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/

Village Hall - The village hall is closed as are all public buildings at this time and the AGM scheduled for May was cancelled until further notice.

Newsletter - we printed 100 copies of the Newsletter in April and May available at the village shop as it was not possible for them to be delivered around the village. The same will happen for June and the July/August which will be a combined edition. It is uncertain as to whether this will be delivered.

Play Area - The proposal for new play equipment is on hold and thanks to Councillor Myra Peters who took over the play area inspections.

#### **Adverse Weather:**

Oxfordshire County Council worked closely with all its partners to monitor the situation with the recent bad weather. As a reminder there are some numbers that you can call to your local provider

aware of them:

- To report fallen trees or other debris which pose a risk to your safety or the safety of others, please call 999
- To report fallen trees or other debris which doesn't pose such a high risk but still needs to be dealt with, please call 101
- If you lose power or can see that a power line has come down please report it by calling 105
- If you are concerned about flooding, you should visit the Oxfordshire Flood Toolkit online - https://www.oxfordshirefloodtoolkit. com - and I will summarise the key numbers to call below:
- If you have a flooding emergency which is a threat to someone's life, contact Oxfordshire Fire and Rescue Service on 999
- To report flooding relating to a highway such as blocked ditches, blocked drains or flooding on a road call Oxfordshire County Council Floodline on 0345 310 1111
- To report flooding from a main river contact  $the \, Environment \, Agency \, through \, the \, Floodline$ (Tel: 0345 988 1188 or 0800 80 70 60) or visit their website
- If your property is at immediate risk of surface water flooding please contact Thames Valley Police on 101

OUR USUAL SUNDAY MORNING SERVICES ARE CANCELLED AND OUR CHURCH REMAINS FIRMLY LOCKED AS DO ALL PUBLIC BUILDINGS.

From Government guidelines, it would seem that this will not be reviewed until August and, only then, will places of worship and other public buildings be open if it is safe to do so.

There is updated news on their website from the Diocese of Oxford as some restrictions on lockdown are very slowly easing.

Incumbents can now enter their Church buildings and can appoint more than one person for each Church in their Benefice to enter the Church building separately on a rota basis. Individuals not in the same household are not allowed to enter together. Social distancing must be observed at all times. Please read the facts on Guidance on praying on the C of E website.

There is information on the website by the Central Council of Church Bellringers and there are strict guidelines in place regarding ringing of bells.

People may visit the Churchyard and tend graves provided social distancing is observed. In consultation with the Vicar and Churchwardens, the Parish Council agreed to continue with the mowing of the Churchyard. For the sake of safety and in their own interest, it is best that people do not enter the Churchyard whilst mowing is in progress. The Vicar is emailing the Weekly Sheet. The Weekly Sheet gives full details on how you can do this.* 

Bishop Steven of Oxford is encouraging everybody to pause at 11.00am each day (if their work permits) to say The Lord's Prayer and the 23rd Psalm which is very comforting in these stressful times.

You can still **SAVE YOUR USED STAMPS AND PRINTER CARTRIDGES** – but please keep them at home until it is possible to re-open the Church.

At the present time **IT IS NOT POSSIBLE TO RECYCLE USED CANS FOR CHURCH FUNDS**, so please recycle them in the normal way. Hopefully, we shall be able to start up this project again in the not too distant future. As everybody will appreciate this project has been a great help with Church funds. With no Services, there are no weekly collections, and with the Church being locked, income is virtually nil apart from the few members who are on the Parish Giving Scheme. Insurance on the building and contents is due in June at over £1000 plus we have to contribute towards our Parish Share. If you do feel able to make a donation, which would be very much appreciated, perhaps you could drop a cheque into the Vicarage, next to Bloxham Museum, or to Susan Richardson at 16 Church Lane. We desperately want our Church to be up and running again for the community as soon as it is possible to do so. The collecting tin is still available in New Road Stores for your loose change and we thank the proprietors for allowing this. THANK YOU if you feel able to help.

**DOG BAGS ARE AVAILABLE IN THE CHURCH PORCH.** Please only take what you need. Dale and the Churchwardens would like to say a HUGE THANK YOU to Sam Hughes and her team of volunteers who are helping the vulnerable and elderly by shopping and collecting prescriptions, etc. Sometimes just a wave through the window is enough to let people know that they are not forgotten. Please keep a look out for your elderly neighbours and we remind everybody that they should only deal with people they know.
