Chairman and Vice-Chairman 2021/2022 - Councillor Marlene Cowell was appointed as Chairman and Mandie McCullagh was appointed as Vice-Chairman.

**Councillor Michael Haynes** – Michael Haynes has resigned from the Parish Council.

HRH, The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh - As a mark of respect, the village flag was lowered to half-mast and although there was not a physical Book of Condolence due to Covid-19 restrictions, this had been available on-line.

Milcombe Senior Citizen's Club - The Club has recently closed and the organisers Tony and Joan Stickings were thanked for all their work over many years, running the Club.

Footpaths in Bloxham - Walkers going over Hobb Hill will notice posts and string at the gates and on the footpath. The farmer is using these to guide users to the location of the Public Right of Way. The farmer will be making hay in the field this year. If the ground becomes compacted it becomes unusable. Walkers should try to keep to the right, close to the hedge on the way up from Courtington Lane and at the top, walk straight down to the kissing gate at the bottom on Ells Lane. Please keep to the paths and enjoy your walks up Hobb Hill...a good pair of wellies / boots always

**Elections** – Local elections are being held on 6 May 2021. Parish Council elections were scheduled for May 2022.

Horse and Groom PH - The pub was scheduled to re-open on 17 May 2021 and residents are encouraged to support the pub where they can.

Wheelie Bins - Residents are kindly requested not to block the footpaths with their wheelie bins, where possible. If they could also be collected back in as soon as they had been emptied, this would avoid the footpaths being blocked for those pedestrians with pushchairs or wheelchair users.

Snow Warden/Grit Bins - If anyone in the village would to volunteer to be a Snow Warden to help clear the footpaths in adverse weather conditions, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council. Grit bins are all full and grit may be used on slippery public footpaths and roads only. It should not be used for private property use.

Litter Pick - The annual village litter pick will be held at the end of May 2021. More details to follow in due course.

# URGENT APPEAL FOR PARISH COUNCILLORS

The Parish Council is urgently appealing for new Councillors. The PC is functioning on the bare minimum of three Councillors - there should be seven.

If one more Councillor steps down, there won't be a Parish Council and Cherwell District Council will take over.

In this scenario, there won't be any local representatives to comment on planning applications, to cut the grass, to arrange

for footpaths to be tidied, liaising with the County Council over highway matters, pay for the servicing of the Church clock, pay for the village newsletter, supporting the project for a new play area, accessing developer funding for village improvements, maintaining the current play area, assist residents with queries. At the moment all this and more, is falling to three people, which is not fair.

So if the Milcombe community does not want this good work to stop, we need four new Councillors ASAP.

This is a turning point and unless the community steps up, the Parish Council will be no more as the current three Councillors cannot carry on as they are.



# MINUTES OF THE MILCOMBE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING HELD ON ZOOM ON TUESDAY 11 MAY 2021 AT 8.00PM

**PRESENT:** Chairman, Councillor Marlene Cowell; Councillors Mandie McCullough and Myra Peters.

ALSO IN ATTENDANCE: Theresa Goss (Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer) and two members of the public.

**APOLOGIES**: County Councillor Kieron Mallon and District Councillor Hugo Brown.

Thanks were passed to Mark Boardman for producing the leaflets regarding the need for new Parish Councillors and also to those volunteers who had delivered them around the village. This support was much appreciated by the Parish Council.

The Chairman reminded the meeting that anyone who wished to apply to be co-opted onto the Parish Council, should contact the Clerk for more details.

**1/21 MINUTES** - The minutes of the meeting held on 7 May 2019 were agreed as a correct record and signed by the Chairman.

**2/21 MATTERS ARISING** - There were no matters arising from the minutes of the meeting held on 7 May 2019.

**3/21 CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2020/2021** – Prior to the meeting, the Chairman had circulated her report on the Parish Council's

work for the last 12 months.

The report covered issues including grants, planning matters, the play area, Cuckoo Walk, village organisations, Milcombe Newsletter and Milcombe Charities. The Chairman also paid tribute to HRH, The Prince Philip Duke of Edinburgh, Keith Mitchel MBE and Beryl Whing, who had all passed away in the last 12 months.

The Chairman also thanked the Councillors and Clerk for their work during the year.

**7/21 VILLAGE ORGANISATIONS** – The Chairman advised that an update on the village hall and the Milcombe Newsletter had been covered in the Chairman's report. However, the Village Hall Committee still needed to find a Treasurer.

Thanks were passed to Mark Boardman for publishing the Newsletter and also to Nigel Davis and John Ellison for erecting the new noticeboard outside the Village Hall.

**8/21 RESIDENTS' QUESTIONS** – There were no questions.

The Chairman thanked everyone for attending and the meeting was closed.

#### MILCOMBE PARISH COUNCIL

THIS IS AN EXTRACT FROM THE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT FOR 2020/2021 TO THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING - 11 MAY 2021

THE FULL REPORT CAN BE FOUND ON THE PARISH COUNCIL WEBSITE ALONG WITH REPORTS FROM COUNTY COUNCILLOR KIERON MALLON AND DISTRICT COUNCILLOR HUGO BROWN

The report covered the activities of Milcombe Parish Council during 2020 up to the present. Due to Coronavirus, all meetings after March 2020 were held via Zoom.

MILCOMBE PARISH COUNCIL normally meets 7 times a year including the Annual Parish Meeting. An Extraordinary Meeting was held on April 20th, 2021, to discuss the format of PC meetings once the emergency legislation for virtual meetings expired on May 7th, 2021. Councillors believed it would not be safe to hold physical meetings at the present time partly due to the size of the Hall but will continue to review the position.

7 Councillors were elected in May 2018 which is the requirement for MPC. Alex Honey and Clare Jones had resigned in 2019 and, despite advertising for new Councillors to be co-opted to fill the vacancies, no names had

been put forward. Sadly, Peter Booth resigned due to ill health in March 2021 and Michael Haynes resigned on May 4th, 2021. This left the PC with the minimum of 3 Councillors. At the Annual Meeting of the PC on May 4th, Marlene Cowell was re-elected as Chairman, Mandie McCullagh as Vice-Chairman and the 3rd remaining Councillor is Myra Peters.

The fact that there were now only 3 Councillors put the PC in a crisis with the worst scenario being that if one of the three remaining Councillors resigned, MPC would be no more and would be taken over by CDC, meaning that residents would have no say in how Milcombe village is run. An out and out effort has been made to deliver a letter to all households explaining the situation and appealing for 4 new Councillors to be co-opted to make up the full complement of 7. This would take the PC forward to 2022 when elections for MPC will take place.

THANK YOU to Mark Boardman for printing the letter and to those who delivered it.

The report contained details of Planning, the Play Area, Dovecote site, Cuckoo Walk, the Pump site, grass cutting, service and maintenance of the Church clock, Milcombe Charities and other items in which the PC is involved.

The PC has also responded to a number of Consultations from CDC and OCC which is all part of a PC's remit.

. The report concluded with tributes to HRH Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh, Keith R. Mitchell and Beryl Whing.

# THE OLD POST OFFICE

This is actually a postcard (possibly early or pre 1940's) showing the old Post Office and general store with the original thatched roof kept by Ernest and Ethel Guy. He was the postman delivering the post around the village on his post bike twice a day (two deliveries) and Mrs. Guy looked after

and served in the shop. All groceries could be purchased. I can remember my mother giving me a list and ration books. Mr. Guy's car can be seen on the little green. In those days there were no supermarkets, buses into Banbury were infrequent apart from work times, and very few people had cars. The pole which can be seen is a telegraph pole as the Post Office had a telephone. There was no electricity, mains water or sewage which all came later.

The old blacksmiths where Tom

Tibbetts used to shoe horses also has the original thatch. Farmers from the villages around used to bring their horses to be shod watched by the village children.

I was told that the building to the left which is the garage to Combe House (or Combe Cottage as it was then) was a bakery, but I am not sure how true that was.

# THE OLD ROW OF COTTAGES

The row of dilapidated cottages was to the left of Combe Cottage on land where 'Hillside' currently stands. In 1947 when we first came to Milcombe people were still living in them, mainly downstairs, as it was too dangerous to go upstairs as parts of the roofs were in danger of collapse. As not all were occupied, some families made use of two adjacent cottages, one for daily living and one for sleeping.





# **CORONATION DAY**

This is an enlargement of a small photograph less than 2 inches square, it was taken on Coronation Day on June 2nd, 1953. (I was just coming up 12!). We all lined up in fancy dress ready to process up Horton Lane, along Main Road to the old school which was being used as a Village Hall before it was renovated. I think the children were all given a celebration tea and a keepsake Coronation mug. I still have mine as I am sure many others do. This was followed by children's sports in The Close field. All the houses were decorated, many with home-made bunting.

I hope my memory has served me well. I am sure if I have got any of the facts wrong, somebody will let me know. Marlene Cowell (May 2020)
