Volunteer Link-Up Scheme – The Parish Council would like to develop a Volunteer Link-Up Scheme for the village, which would mean that volunteers



would heal that volunteers would be a point of contact for vulnerable people in the village, if they needed help with daily tasks. If you would be interested in volunteering for the role and would like more information, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council.

**Dog Fouling** – Residents were asked to ensure that they clean up after their dogs because a lot of mess had not be picked up along Main Street. Free dog waste bags were available in the Church and the shop.

**Village Litter Pick** – This will be held on Saturday 28 March 2020. Please contact the Clerk for more details.

**Overhanging Branches/Vegetation** – Please could all residents ensure that vegetation and trees are not overhanging the boundary of their properties and causing a nuisance to neighbours or blocking street lights or touching overhead cables.

**Snow Wardens** – The Parish Council would like to develop a Snow Warden Scheme

The Committee met on February 12th.

A key box has been installed and a solar light is being sourced for the front entrance. Three quotes have been obtained for removal of stage and replace with enclosed storage area, new fire door and renovation of parquet flooring. The quotes ranged from £7793-£9025 excluding VAT. The Committee will now look into the possibility of obtaining grants. They are also looking into the possibility of installing a new Noticeboard on the front wall. Interest will be gauged for support from villagers for a more simple community event rather than holding a fete.



# We provide people with end of life nursing care in their own homes

### NURSING TEAM 01608 641 549

Many people, when asked, say that they wish, when their time comes, to die in familiar surroundings and close to those they know and love – that is, in their own homes.

I am a nurse in the 'Lawrence Home Nursing Team' and I was drawn to work in this organisation because its key aim is to enable this ideal to become a reality, when ever possible, for those facing life limiting illnesses in our catchment area.

All the nurses in the team have experience in caring for people at the end of life and we are guided by a patient's needs and wishes. We can give hands on nursing care, including medications for pain relief and other symptoms and can access specialist advice, when needed, through our close working relationships with family doctors and community nurses.

We aim to give each person the care they need, respecting their own individual requirements. Communication and the building of trusting relationships enables us to be that listening ear, to answer questions, and give emotional support, both to the patient and those closest to them, in the hope that patients and their loved ones can make the most of the time they have left together.

The care we give is free, and highly adaptable: sometimes night care, sometimes care during the day, sometimes working alongside existing carers, sometimes working alone. We look after anyone, aged 18 and over, who is in their last weeks of life. Patients are referred to us by GPs, community and specialist nurses, hospitals, hospices, and sometimes family members.
