Play Area – The new equipment has been very popular with residents and further work would be carried out to lock on the gate.

Wheelie Bins – Residents are kindly requested not to block the footpaths with their wheelie bins, where possible. If they could also be collected back in as soon as they had been emptied, this would avoid the footpaths being blocked for those pedestrians with pushchairs or wheelchair users.

Defibrillator – The defibrillator had been installed at the Village Hall and Parish Councillor Nigel Davis along with John Ellison, were both thanked for assisting with the installation. The defibrillator was donated to the village by the Parish Council as part of the celebrations for HM The Queen's Platinum Jubilee.

Oak Farm – Cherwell District Council would be contacted with regard to completing maintenance on the amenity areas and works to trees on Oak Farm Drive and Oak Farm Close.

Trees/Bushes/Hedges - Residents were reminded that trees/bushes/hedges should not be causing an obstruction because they were overhanging a boundary onto a footpath or road. If an obstruction was occurring in the village, it should be reported to https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/

Proposed 20mph Speed Restrictions – The results of the village survey showed that the majority of the village are in favour of 20mph speed restrictions in Milcombe and these results would be submitted to the County Council to support the Parish Council's application. The County Council would be contacted again to progress the vehicle speed and volume survey.

Land to the East of Heath Close – Tim Northey from Abbeymill Homes attended the meeting and provided information to Councillors and residents on the proposed scheme. In readiness for the submission of the application, the Parish





Patient Participation Group (PPG) update for village newsletters

At the July meeting of the PPG it was agreed with representatives from the practice that we should attempt to ensure regular updates are provided for local residents on the latest news from our surgeries. The detail behind these headlines can be found on the practice website: https://www.bloxhamsurgery.co.uk

- · Face-to-face appointments are now available on request. Many patients continue to prefer a telephone conversation with their GP, but it is possible to book an appointment. Routine appointments are offered within two weeks. However, if you need to see a doctor urgently, please ring at 8.00 a.m. There are always several staff taking these calls but there is often a queue. You can either stay on the line or leave your name and contact details and the practice will return your call.
- ·The Bloxham Pharmacy is currently completing over 250 prescriptions a day. This is an immense workload for a small team and patients can help by ensuring repeat requests are submitted a week before their medicine is required. Even more important is the need for patients to collect their prescriptions. Hundreds of uncollected prescriptions have to be destroyed each month. This has to be done safely and in line with government requirements and is a significant waste of time and money.
- · A number of new doctors and health professionals have joined the practice over the past few months and our wider partnership with NORA (North Oxfordshire Rural Alliance) is leading to a number of exciting new developments. Our physiotherapist will see patients with aches and sprains without the need for referral from the doctor. From the autumn, NORA practices will develop a rolling programme of more flexible working so that it will be possible to book early evening appointments with a doctor, (though not necessarily with your own GP.) The appointment of paramedics has increased our capacity to assess patients and ensure they receive the treatment they need.

We shall write again after the next meeting of the PPG In October but in the meantime please remember to check the Practice website for news and announcements. Thank you.
