Christmas Day Lunch – A £100 donation had been made to

the Christmas Day lunch which was held in Bloxham, but was open to Milcombe residents too. It had been a resounding success and Pud Hawkins, Bee Myson and all their helpers are thanked for all of their hard work to make it such a great event.

Defibrillator – Information on the specification for the defibrillator and case would be submitted to the PCC with a view to obtaining a faculty from the Diocese for it to be located in the Church porch.

Volunteer Link-Up Scheme – The Parish Council would like to develop a Volunteer Link-Up Scheme for the village, which would mean that volunteers would be a point of contact for vulnerable people in the village, if they needed help with daily tasks. If you would be interested in volunteering for the role and would like more information, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council.

Grit Bin – A request had been made for a new grit bin in the area of Oak Farm Close/Oak Farm Drive, however the Parish Council needs to establish whether or not the roads in the estate have been adopted by the County Council. If they have not, then a grit bin cannot be installed by the Parish Council.

Dog Fouling – Residents were asked to ensure that they clean up after their dogs because a lot of mess had not be picked up along Main Street. Free dog waste bags were available in the Church and the shop.

Grass Cutting Contract 2020/2021 – The grass cutting contract for 2020/2021 has been awarded to Nigel Prickett. Nigel has been the contractor in the village for a number of years and does a very good job keeping the village looking neat.

Jacob Kaye Memorial Bench – A contractor would be asked to supply a quote for undertaking maintenance to the bench in Portland Road

Vacancy – Due a resignation, there was vacancy on the Parish Council. If anyone was interested in being co-opted onto the Parish Council, please contact the Clerk for more information.

Snow Wardens – The Parish Council would like to develop a Snow Warden Scheme for the village, which would mean that in the event of adverse weather, you would be called upon to clear footpaths in the village. If you would be interested in volunteering for the role, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council.

Highways – Repairs which were required to potholes should be reported to the County Council's Fix My Street web site. https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/

Residents were reminded that trees/bushes/hedges should not be causing an obstruction because they were overhanging a boundary onto a footpath or road. If an obstruction was occurring in the village, it should be reported to https://fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/

Play Area – The Clerk had been in contact with Cherwell District Council and Sanctuary Housing but a date for the release of the Section 106 funds for the new play equipment had still not been confirmed.

THE **DOVECOTE**

THE DOVECOTE - During the Celebration afternoon a Milcombe Quiz was held which included several questions about the Dovecote. Some years ago The Four Shires magazine ran an article on Dovecotes in the area and the Milcombe Dovecote was



mentioned. There is also information on the OCC Oxfordshire Historic Environment Records website. Here are a few of the facts.

The octagonal Dovecote is of medieval design but constructed of ironstone rubble in the early 18th century and contains around 850 nestholes. It was originally part of Manor Farm owned by Christ Church College, Oxford. It fell into disrepair and in the 1940's/50's housed chickens and later used as a farm store. It was restored around 1980 as part of the planning project when the houses on the Dovecote site were built and is now in the care of CDC who carried out some remedial repairs during 2019. The soft floodlighting was a Millennium project by the Parish Council.
