Tribute to Keith Mitchell CBE – Keith Mitchell sadly passed away on Wednesday 26 August 2020. Keith was Milcombe's District Councillor for many years and regularly attended Milcombe Parish Council meetings. He was very supportive and approachable and could always be relied upon for help and advice when requested. Keith held a monthly surgery on Saturday mornings at the Horse & Groom which the Chairman attended frequently on Parish Council matters. He was also the Parish Council's internal auditor which he did for a good many years without charge. A letter of condolence would be sent to his wife and family.

Wheelie Bins - Residents are kindly requested not to block the footpaths with their wheelie bins, where possible. If they could also be collected back in as soon as they had been emptied, this would avoid the footpaths being blocked for those pedestrians with pushchairs or wheelchair users.

Road Signage - Oxfordshire County Council would be contacted to attend a site meeting to discuss additional road signage around the area of the Horse and Groom to encourage drivers to slow down.

Play Area – The play area had now re-opened following its closure during the Covid-19 Pandemic lockdown. Work was continuing to investigate new equipment, however since the funding from Sanctuary Housing was no longer available, work on the project would have to be started from scratch.

Church Yard Maintenance – Work would be undertaken to complete maintenance work to tidy up the Church Yard.

Dog Fouling – Residents are asked to ensure that they clean up after their dogs because a lot of mess had not be picked up, especially along Main Street. Dog waste bags are available from New Road Stores and the Church

porch.

Snow Warden – If anyone in the village would to volunteer to be a Snow Warden to help clear the footpaths in adverse weather conditions, please contact the Clerk to the Parish Council.

Highways - Repairs which were required to potholes should be reported to the County Council's Fix My Street web site. https:// fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/

Trees/Bushes/Hedges - Residents were reminded that trees/bushes/hedges should not be causing an obstruction because they were overhanging a boundary onto a footpath or road. If an obstruction was occurring in the village, it should be reported to https:// fixmystreet.oxfordshire.gov.uk/

Defibrillator – Church House at Kidlington was currently closed and all staff were working from home. However, the Diocesan Advisory Committee would consider the request for a faculty for the location of a defibrillator in the Church porch after the lockdown had been relaxed.

Adverse Weather:

Oxfordshire County Council works closely with all its partners to monitor the weather and as a reminder there are some numbers that you can call to report weather related issues if you become aware of them:

- · To report fallen trees or other debris which pose a risk to your safety or the safety of others, please call 999
- To report fallen trees or other debris which doesn't pose such a high risk but still needs to be dealt with, please call 101
- If you lose power or can see that a power line has come down please report it by calling
- If you are concerned about flooding, you should visit the Oxfordshire Flood Toolkit online - https://www.oxfordshirefloodtoolkit. com – and $\dot{\boldsymbol{l}}$ will summarise the key numbers to call below:
- · If you have a flooding emergency which is a threat to someone's life, contact Oxfordshire Fire and Rescue Service on 999
- To report flooding relating to a highway such as blocked ditches, blocked drains or flooding on a road call Oxfordshire County Council Floodline on 0345 310 1111
